Give me leave dear Br to tell you how much I'm concerned at my dear sisters misfortune, for I know you have a very great share in whatever happens to her, & therefore I can't help giving you this trouble, to assure you how much I partake in it, but I hope she's in no danger, & so must comfort our selves with that, I have been extream ill all this week my self, or else I shou'd have answerd your obliging letter, but I hope we shall have the happiness of seeing you now soon, tho' I can't help saying, I'm truly sorry upon this occasion, Mr Talbot desires his humble service to you & dear sister Dav: I beg mine to her & S^{is} Ivorys I am sincerely
